



Quick Facts: NOLA GOV. Online - Live & Archived Streaming Video

- Citizens can watch anywhere in the world, and you don't need to watch based on a schedule (though live broadcasts as well as archived ones will be available).
- Video files are "indexed" by agenda item, so you can watch only the section of meeting you are interested in. Archived video with indexes will be made available typically within one hour after the meeting is adjourned.
- Minutes of the meetings will include votes taken and links to the related discussions. The (unapproved) minutes will be available within days after the meeting has been held.
- Each agenda item can be searched based on the title of the legislative instrument introduced, or by keywords contained in the agenda.
- Citizens can subscribe to specific topics and automatically receive new audio and video content downloaded to personal mobile devices or computers.
- Citizens can add video search or subscription link to a website, making content available on their website.
- Citizens can share video with friends over email and social networks like Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn.

Functionality - In Six Months

- Each agenda item will contain links to other documents (resolutions, motions, ordinances, maps, photos, staff reports, etc.) Anything submitted to the Clerk of Council for inclusion in the agenda will be published to the web.
- As additional committees and agencies come online, citizens can follow and track the progress of legislation through other bodies (committees, boards and commissions, etc.) to final dispensation by the New Orleans City Council.
- Video programming during hurricanes and other emergencies and video programming concerning specific recovery projects and initiatives will be available.
- Citizen selected Segments can be burned to CD or DVD.
- Podcasting Download Feeds to Mobile Devices.
